

## Block Yardage

### Background

- (1) 4" x 8" rectangle
- (1) 9" square
- (4) 2" squares
- (1) 4½" square

### Large Scale Floral

- (1) 3½" square

### Small Scale Print #1

- (1) 7½" square

Choose fabrics that look solid from a distance for these color families.

### Color Family #3 (Blue)

- (1) 6" square

### Medium

- (1) 4" x 8" rectangle

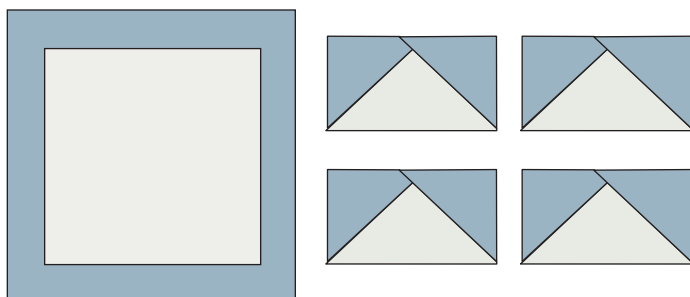

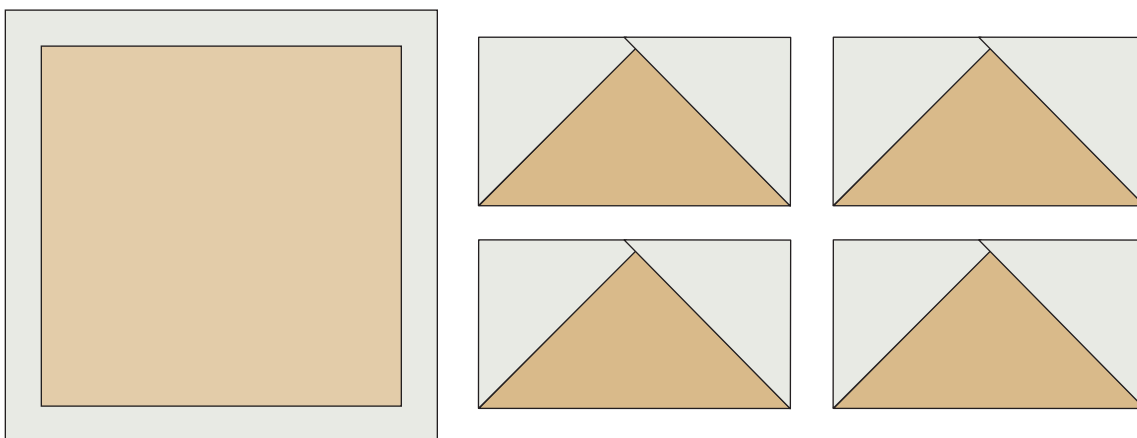
### Making the Flying Geese Patches



- Using the 4½" Background square and the 6" Color Family #3 square make 4 Flying Geese Patches. Each Patch is squared up to 2" x 3½".



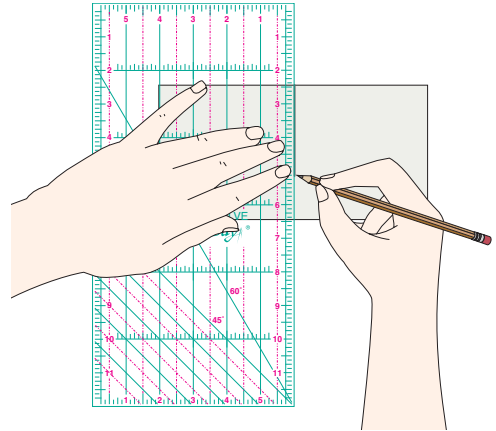
- Using the 9" Background square and the 7½" Small Scale Print square make 4 Flying Geese Patches. Each Patch is squared up to 3½" x 6½".



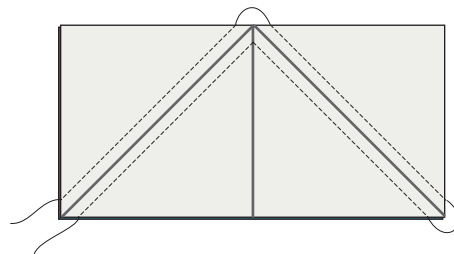
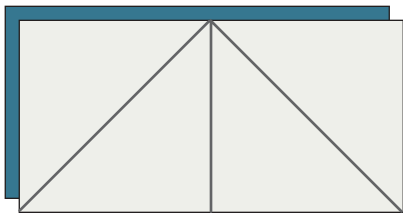
# Making the Triangle Pieced Squares



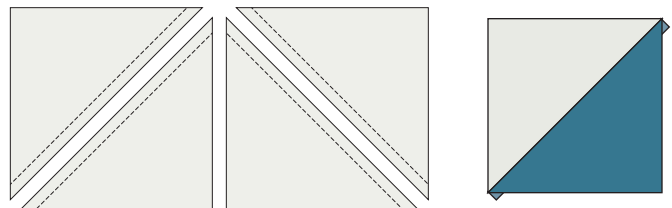
1. On the wrong side of the 4" x 8" Background square draw a grid and then draw one diagonal line in each square.



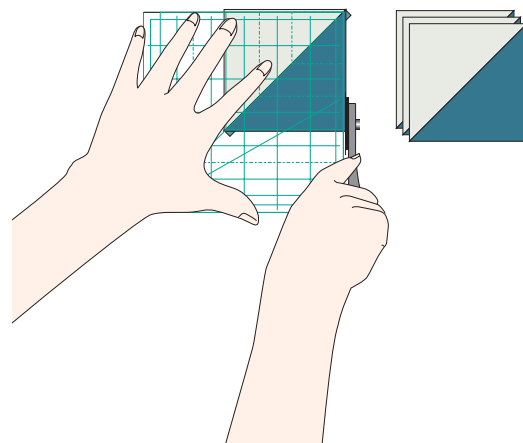
2. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the drawn line on both sides.



3. Set the seams and cut along all the drawn lines. Press seams toward the darker fabric.

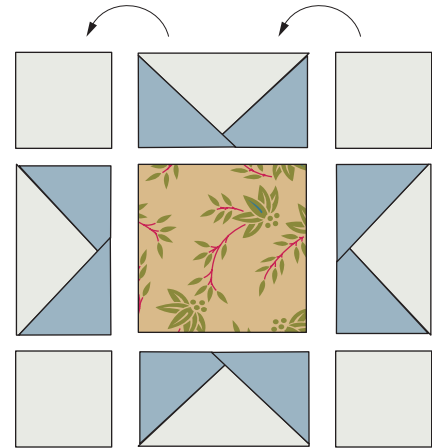


4. Square up patches to  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

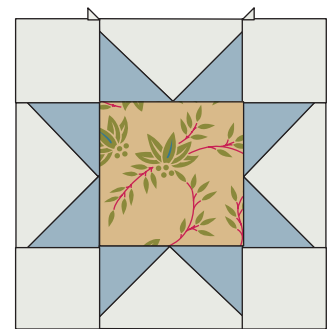
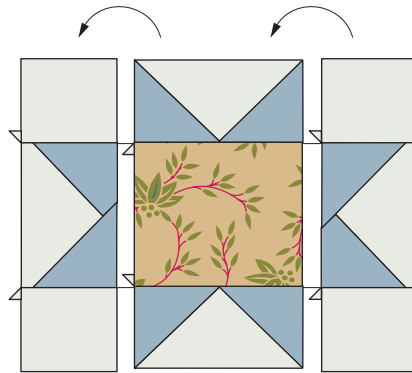
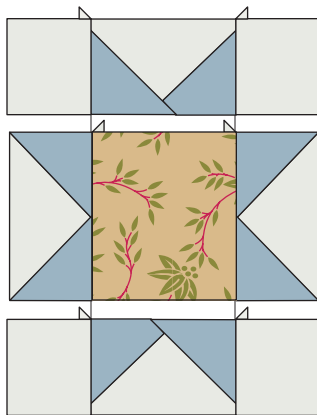


# Completing the Block

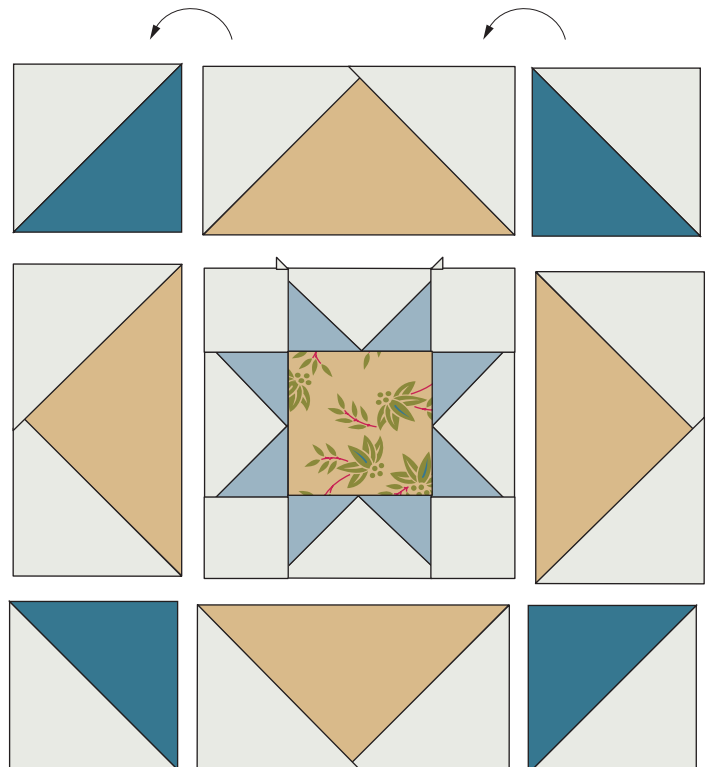
1. Lay out the pieces needed for the Center Star.



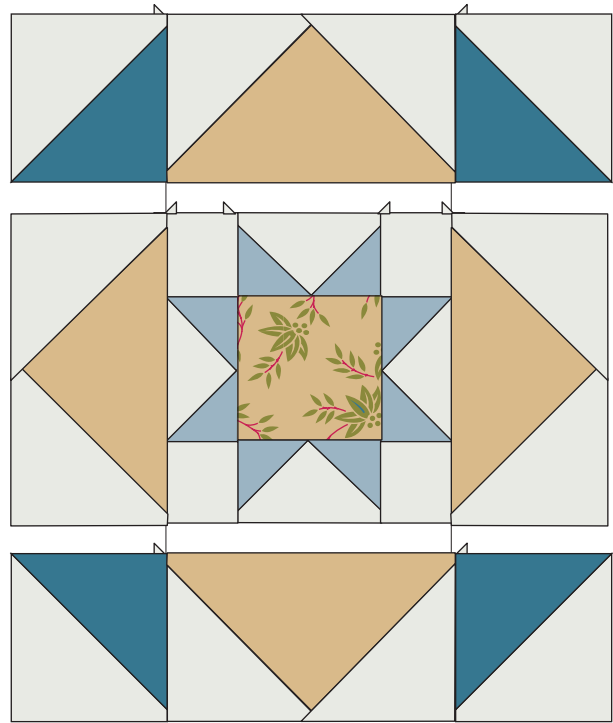
2. Sew the Star together by first completing the Rows and then sewing the Rows together. Press seams away from the Geese Patches.



3. Lay out the pieces for the block.



4. Sew to complete the Rows. Press seam allowances away from the Geese Patches.



5. Sew the Rows together. Press seams toward the Center Row.
